

# NEWS FROM THE PARISHES

The news items this time feature only Buscot and Great Coxwell, as by their nature, they are longer than usual. Coleshill and Eaton Hastings will feature next time.

## BUSCOT



At the end of November 2016, St. Mary's Buscot suffered the theft of its richly carved and gilded, double-sided Spanish Baroque lectern, dating from about 1700, which was given to the church about 1900 by Sir Alexander Henderson (later first Lord Faringdon). It is one of a number of historically and artistically significant furnishings with which he beautified the church between 1890 and 1907, and it features in Charles Tracey's book *Continental Church Furniture in England: A Traffic in Piety*. The police investigated the theft, but no leads were forthcoming. However, in August 2017, the Archdeacon of Dorchester, Judy French, was contacted by a Suffolk-based fine arts dealer who had bought it in good faith, but who, looking at the illustration in Tracey's book, thought that it could belong to St. Mary's. It was duly identified by John and Maggie

Burrows, who brought it back to the church from Suffolk in October. It will again be displayed in the church when CCTV has been installed and the lectern has been secured. *The photograph shows the returned lectern, displaying the Royal Arms of Castile and Leon.*

## LETTER FROM THE VICARAGE

Bishop Steven, who was appointed Bishop of Oxford last year, is encouraging every church, chaplaincy and school in the diocese over the coming year to read, study and reflect on the opening words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, which are found in Matthew's Gospel, chapter 5, verses 1 to 10, and are known as the Beatitudes. In these verses, Jesus speaks words of encouragement, joy and hope to all who follow him. The Beatitudes tell us of the blessings which are given to those who are righteous, humble, merciful and pure in heart, and to those who are peacemakers and have courage in practising their faith. They give us a picture of Jesus himself; and they show us that to be more Christ-like means for us to become a more contemplative church, a more compassionate church and a more courageous church.

A contemplative church spends time with God. A compassionate church mourns with the suffering in the world, and is full of loving-kindness which leads to action. A courageous church puts its heart and soul into everything that it does. It seeks justice, peace and reconciliation, and is ready to share the good news of the Christian faith.

As we reflect on the Beatitudes and think about the life of the church in the Oxford Diocese and in our locality, Bishop Steven hopes that we will see the many good things that are happening, and that our vision for the church in the life of the community will be re-kindled.

The churches in the diocese have been invited by Bishop Steven to share in an Advent Study course based on the Beatitudes, and we have organised a three-week course for the Badbury Group of Churches based on this material, on Wednesday mornings and evenings in December. Our seasonal study groups now have about 25 people attending them from across our four churches; and we enjoy fellowship, we spend time in prayer and we study the Scriptures, always looking for ways in translating what we have learnt into our own lives. We hope that we will be enriched by this Advent course, and by what we learn from one another. The Beatitudes are all about the kingdom of heaven, and of God's vision for human life. Do take the opportunity of reading or re-reading them. They offer words of encouragement for everyone.
