## New Wall at St. Mary's Church Yard

We finally put things straight with the Church yard wall at St Mary's this autumn. The wall had slowly developed a very strong inward curve as a large Ash tree had grown over many years and was pushing against it. Things came to a head when an Elder sapling also managed to get established and squeezed the stones further. The wall was going to fall into the Church yard, if left for much longer. With the help of the National Trust we were able to save the large Ash tree from being felled, much to everyone's joy, although the small Elder did have to be removed.

Following approval from the Diocese the wall was dismantled and rebuilt by local builder Nick Mustoe of S. Mustoe's and Sons who managed to put in two lintels to allow the Ash tree to stay in place and allow room for future growth. Lime mortar and local Cotswold stone was used to rebuild the wall either side of the tree and make the wall secure and in good health especially on the south east corner. The Church yard wall should be good for many years to come. Our heartfelt thanks to our neighbours, the National Trust and Nick Mustoe and his team.

# Tribute to her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11

The death of Queen Elizabeth II affected us all as we remembered her in all our Benefice Churches. Here is a tribute to a Queen of great faith, mindful of the King she served.

St Mary's marked the tragic loss to the Church and Country of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the head of the Church of England.

The Queens death was announced on September 8th 2022 and the following morning the Church bell was rung along with other Church bells throughout the country. The bell chimed 96 times, once for every year of her life.

The following day, Saturday September 10th, a prayer vigil was held in Church. The service was led by Reverend Maureen Turner and attended by regular and irregular Churchgoers. Many people brought flowers.

A memory table was set for the flowers, a portrait of her Majesty from her younger days was placed, various pieces of peoples memories of the Queen found there way to the table and a book of condolence was opened. The book was signed by so many people all recalling thoughts and recollections of our late Queen, she was loved so much by so many. The Paschal candle was lit and candles were available to light from this and placed in the font.

St Mary's remained open throughout the period of mourning. The memory table and book of condolence remained open whilst the Queen lay in state in Balmoral, Edinburgh and Westminster. It was closed shortly after the funeral at Windsor Castle.

Sunday September 18th saw a beautiful Holy Communion Remembrance service for Queen Elizabeth. Special prayers were said reflecting on the Queens devotion to duty and her service to God and Country. This service was particularly well attended and the Church resounded with the sounds of hymns sung with much emotion.

We shall all miss Queen Elizabeth greatly.

Church Wardens, alongside the parish Priest, are responsible for the day-to-day functioning of the Church in their communities. Some duties include supporting Vicar and other Church personnel; encouraging members of the Parochial Church Council to promote the pastoral mission of the Church, ensure that the buildings, contents, and Church grounds are maintained in good order and consult with Diocesan personnel when concerns arise. Wardens have been known to harvest the vicarage fruit trees (not compulsory).


