This festive occasion will be the first wedding at Eaton Hastings since Suzanne and Michael Tearle's wedding in 2012, and will be conducted jointly by Hugh's father, Christopher Lewis and David Williams.

GREAT COXWELL

On April 20th, the funeral took place of Colonel Geoff Lee, one of our best loved residents of Great Coxwell, and the church was full to overflowing.

Geoff's distinguished military career took him to Malaya, Hong Kong, Berlin, Londonderry and Prague and finally to the Defence Academy at Shrivenham. Geoff was the founder of the Great Coxwell Christmas Crib tableau in the mediaeval Great Barn, and the Christmas Eve Nativity Procession and Barn Service, which is now in its eighteenth year. It is our best attended service of the year, and has raised large sums of money for the Bateman's Trust children's charity's work in Chennai, India.

LETTER FROM THE VICARAGE

Dear Friends,

Our rhythm of Sunday services, seasonal festivals and weekly Wednesday services of Morning Prayer provide the foundation of our worshipping life as church communities. Each Sunday we have Morning or Evening Prayer in one of our churches, and Holy Communion in another; and we are blessed in the Badbury Group of Churches with a rich diversity of tradition in the form of our services.

However, another important dimension of our worshipping life is found in the occasional offices: baptisms, weddings and funerals, and occasionally services for the blessing of marriages, memorial services and graveside services for the interment of ashes. Through these services we reach out to a larger number of people, to whom the church extends a warm welcome.

On average we have about six baptisms, four weddings and eight funerals (or interments of ashes) each year. Some baptisms take place in our monthly Communion services and others take place on a Sunday afternoon, depending on circumstances. Now that I have been your parish priest for seven years, I have

had the privilege, on occasion, of conducting a couple's wedding and then the baptism, in turn, of their first child and their second child. In this way relationships are formed and developed; and I have been heartened by how many of the couples whose weddings I have conducted have remained in contact with us. Indeed several brides and grooms are now regularly involved with the life and worship of one or other of our churches.

There are indeed other ways of keeping in touch with those who have received the ministry of our occasional offices, and in particular, I regularly invite the families of all those whose funerals I have conducted over the past seven years to our annual All Souls service, which is an opportunity of remembering departed loved ones in a special way.

I believe it is important to provide sensitive and helpful preparation for all those who approach us for baptisms, weddings and funerals, but I also believe that it is important that we extend a welcome which is open and accessible. In this way our relatively small yet faithful church communities can touch the lives of many.
